We pray that through all of this that you will be edified (1 Cor 14:26) as we focus wholly on our Triune God and His inspired Word.

We believe that every part of the service should be participatory. By this we mean, we encourage you to sing every song, open your Bibles, read along, and take notes during the sermon, engage in responsive reading, and pray with us.We hope that through this you will grow in the Word and will behold the glory of Christ.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

Read Acts 5:33-42

Talk about it...

What is your biggest takeaway from Acts 5:33-42?

What can we learn from the apostles about gospel ministry in Acts 5?  
What does this passage teach us about being ready to preach the gospel at all times? What does this passage teach us about God's sovereignty over persecution?

Read John 15:18-21. What does Jesus say? What is the point that He is making? Do you believe this statement is true for you? Explain.  
How ought Jesus' understanding of suffering for His sake shape how you live?

React to this from Dietrich Bonhoeffer: "Suffering...is the badge of the true Christian. The disciple is not above his master....Luther reckoned suffering among the marks of the true church.... Discipleship means allegiance to the suffering Christ, and it is therefore not at all surprising that Christians should be called upon to suffer."

Peter restates in v. 29 that "We must obey God rather than men." How does this need to shape your own actions today? Is there anyone you know whom the Lord is prompting you to gently challenge with this exhortation? What are the fears that are keeping you from obeying Jesus how you ought? Are you keeping back an aspect of faithfulness because you're afraid of what others think of you?  
What are some examples?

React to this from Kent Hughes: "The absence of persecution may actually indicate something is wrong."  
In your thinking about this topic - and in your discussions with others - do you sense that your heart and mind are attempting to excuse a lack of costly obedience? Explain.

Our text shows us that God's plans cannot be thwarted - nor can the church. Jesus promised the church's eternal existence. Is the value that Jesus places on the church commensurate with the way you treat, view, and prioritize the church? Explain.  
How can we place as much value on the church as Jesus does? How will this be evident in our posture towards it?

Are you prepared to suffer dishonor for Christ's name? Would you count it a privilege to do so? If not, what would it take for you to adopt this perspective? Take several moments to ponder and reflect on 5:40-41. Are you like the apostles? Is the American church on the whole like them? How can we cultivate an obedience like theirs where suffering for Christ is an honor?

React to this from Iain Duguid: "In reality, the Bible and church history show us that God loves us and has a wonderful plan for the glory of his own name, which is far and away the best purpose for our lives. God wants people's eyes to be opened to his glory, and that happens when people see men and women who count obedience to God as more valuable than their personal comfort, reputation, and even life itself. How can you be lashed with whips to within an inch of your life, as the apostles were, and still go away rejoicing that you are counted worthy to suffer for the name of Jesus? You can't if your own interests are at the center of your universe."

Take a moment to pray for the persecuted church around the world.  
Take some time to confess and pray together using this text as a guide.
