QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

Read Acts 2:42-47 Talk about it...

What is your biggest takeaway from Acts 2:42-47?

How does this passage in context of the whole chapter show us that the vertical reconciliation of man to God through Christ is inseparably tied to the horizontal reconciliation in the community of God?

What's the most challenging aspect of this text for you? Why? What's the most encouraging aspect of this text? Explain.

What are the characteristics Luke gives us of the early church?
What were activities that the first church was "devoted" to?
How important was Scripture to the early church?
Some believe churches should hold loosely to doctrine and theology and should not emphasize those things too much. What would you say to those people about the importance of doctrine and theology in the local church?

How might you more fully devote yourself to the study of the Scriptures? To prayer? To fellowship? To unity? To generosity?

Can a professing Christian be obedient to anything listed here without being an active, present, member of a local church?

Explain.

React to this from Ajith Fernando: "According to the Bible the entire Christian life, including spiritual growth, battling sin, and Satan, and serving God, are intended to be done in community. Community life is an integral part of the basic Christian life because Christianity is by nature a community religion."

Over the last few weeks we have talked about evangelism of unbelievers that we know in our lives. Undoubtedly, there are also people in your life who profess to be Christian but have little - or nothing - to do with the local church. What would you say to those people? Think together of ways you can have conversations with those people in your life. What prevents you from pursuing the unchurched professing Christians in your life?

The early church was clearly open-handed and sacrificial with their material goods, even willing to sell what they had in order to provide for the needs of others. Would you say that the way you use what God has blessed you with materially reflects what you see in this text? Explain. Read Luke 12:13-21. How does this relate to Acts 2:42-47? What lessons do you see in the Luke passage that we should strive to apply? Would you be willing to sell some of your possessions to provide for poor brothers and sisters in Christ? How can you become more open-handed with your possessions and leverage them for the good of your fellow Christians?

What is the biggest obstacle standing between you and deep, genuine relationships with other believers? How can you better pursue what is in this text?

Take some time to confess and pray together using this text as a guide.
