QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

Read Acts 2:22-36 Talk about it...

What is your biggest takeaway from Acts 2:22-36?

What does Peter choose to focus on in his sermon on Pentecost?
Why do you think he highlights the aspects of Jesus
and the gospel that he does?

How does Peter use the Old Testament in his sermon? What might this tell us about how we should read the Old Testament? What event does Peter say David wrote about in Psalm 16 that could not have been about David? What's his reasoning? What does Peter say David wrote about in Psalm 110? Read Luke 20:41-44. What does Jesus say about Psalm 110?

React to this from NT Wright regarding the resurrection: "It wasn't, simply that the creator God had done something remarkable for one solitary individual, but that, in and through the resurrection, 'the present evil age' has been invaded by the 'age to come,' the time of restoration, return, covenant renewal, and forgiveness. An event has occurred as a result of which the world is a different place, and human beings have the new possibility to become a different kind of people."

What would you say to a professing Christian who deemphasizes the importance of the resurrection?

Why is the vindication of Christ through the resurrection so important? What does it mean for our justification?
What ways do we tend toward self-justification? How can we move more and more away from self-justifying towards a reliance on Jesus as our justification?


We talked about what Martin Luther called the "great exchange:"
What is ours becomes Christ's and what is Christ's becomes ours.
He took our sin, we receive His righteousness. How does this move you to worship? How does it motivate your obedience?

Why is the exaltation of Christ as ruler of the universe such an important aspect of the gospel? Why do we not mention Jesus as King at least as much as we talk of Him as Savior? Why is Jesus as King good news?

How could you use the structure of Peter's gospel outline here to communicate to a non-Christian you know the truth about Jesus and the response that it demands?

Pray for boldness and opportunities to speak clearly for Christ to your existing network of friends and relationships.

Take some time to confess and pray together using this text as a guide.
